A Muscular Move Forward by the United Nations

In 2023, the UN officially recognized that governmental Infrastructures for Peace (I4P) are a powerful and enduring global answer to all forms of violence because of their long-term investment in peacebuilding, non-violent communication, and conflict resolution. To reinforce this idea, the UN's **A New Agenda for Peace** (2023) cites, under Preventing Conflict and Violence and Sustaining Peace, the recommendation to "develop national prevention strategies and strengthen national infrastructures for peace" and furthermore states that "member states seeking to establish or strengthen national 'infrastructures for peace' should be able to access a tailor-made package of support and expertise to strengthen social cohesion and civil society."

Why do we need Ministries & Infrastructures for Peace? So everybody wins.

Think of all the incredible human progress in the last 100 years; and yet, turmoil still exists on a grand scale.

The problem is we don't resolve conflict before it escalates to violence.

As the current caretakers of planet Earth, we owe it to ourselves to lessen this conflict that undermines all that is uplifting, unifying, and good about our world.

Not through violence, because violence only begets more violence.

We do it by inspiring and leading humankind on the latest pioneering adventure in human evolution, and our most important journey of all.

From separation to unity. From separate interests to shared interests. From conflict to peace.

As we take this rewarding journey together, it will become increasingly clear that hard power isn't the only way to ensure our enduring peace.

Human history shows soft power, in the form of compassionate dialogue and international diplomacy, is even more effective.

After all, peace treaties are the result of parties in conflict sitting down in a room across a table, sharing their stories, and working out their differences.

Listening is leadership and the simple act of giving the other side a chance to be heard is the critical first step in creating the common ground that is the foundation of humankind's collective well-being.

Plus, soft power, which can also be thought of as true power, is a lot less expensive. For example, according to The World Peace Index, the cost of violent conflict globally in 2022 was 17.5 trillion dollars. This was 12.9 percent of the Global Domestic Product which equals \$2200 per global citizen.



In the United States, the Cost of Wars Project at Brown University placed the cost to the US taxpayer since 2001 at 6 trillion dollars.

Over the next 35 years, it will cost 1 trillion dollars just to care for injured US veterans.

An additional tragedy for present and future generations is that most wars are funded by borrowing, and by 2053 it is estimated the interest alone on the accumulated US war debt will be 7.9 trillion dollars.

The enormous size of the war debt saddling nations requires that new revenue be used to pay it down.

This takes away funding in other areas that directly impact the quality of life like clean drinking water, disease prevention, elimination of child labor, healthcare, climate change, and veteran services, all of which protect soldiers and citizens in ways no military can.

By using too many resources on hard power in terms of military interventions and punishing sanctions, we create imbalances that make further conflict much more likely, while producing a traumatized generation that requires even more time and resources to heal.

On the other hand, each Ministry, Department & Infrastructure for Peace builds more Muscles of Peace in our world, which exponentially strengthens soft power and our ability to resolve disagreements before they become violent.

This investment in peace will ultimately enable more people across our planet to live lives of peaceful non-violence while using our precious collective resources for positive means.

Generate realistic plans for incentive-based reinvestment of some military spending into the peace industrial complex.

- Provide Peace Education that includes cultural exchanges, educational curricula in de-radicalization, and other peace-related topics.
- Address the digital divide and the separation, misinformation, and violence perpetuated by social media, artificial intelligence, and mass media.
- Promote the United Nations's Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
- Advance gender equality and the greater involvement of women and youth in conflict resolution.



Link peace with environmental and social advances so all rise together as one.

- Foster full democratic participation in elections and rebuild respect for national institutions and the rule of law.
- Seed peacepreneurship to grow local, national, and international economies of peace.
- Begin unburdening the world from the enormous destruction from war.
- Supply progress reports for the country's cabinet on the UN Sustainable
 Development Goals (SDGs) and other domestic and international realities that impact global peace.
- Cultivate international partners to raise money and extend reach and power to build overwhelming global consensus for a peaceful, more equitable world.

Full Text

The Muscles of Peace Global Resolution in Support of Infrastructures for Peace in Governments Worldwide

We, global citizen signatories from 192 Nations, respectfully in one voice, call upon the United Nations (UN) and all countries, both nationally and in collaboration with the community of nations, to create infrastructures in their governments and in civil society to develop and implement policies, programs, and practices that:

- 1. Promote, establish, and maintain human and environmental security and justice in the social, economic, political, educational, and legal spheres, and thus generally the **Culture of Peace**;
- 2. Create and expand **Economies of Peace** and "peacepreneurship" so as to "beat our swords into ploughshares and spears into pruning hooks;"
- 3. Are accepted and supported by and have legitimacy with the people they serve, whether at the local, regional, national, or international level;
- 4. Are sustainable, adaptive, and resilient;
- 5. And may be in the form of, but not limited to, departments of peace, government ministries, peace academies, institutes, schools and councils and private sector enterprises that help:
 - Establish peace as a primary organizing principle in society, both domestically and globally;
 - Direct government policy towards non-violent resolution of conflict prior to escalation to violence and to seek peace by peaceful means in all conflict areas;
 - Promote justice and democratic principles to expand human rights and the security of persons and their communities, consistent with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, related UN treaties and conventions, and the Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace (1999);
 - Promote disarmament and develop and strengthen non-military options for peacemaking, peacebuilding, and peace professionalism;
 - Develop new approaches to non-violent intervention, and utilize constructive dialogue, mediation, and the peaceful resolution of conflict at home and abroad;



- Encourage the involvement in local, national, and global peacebuilding of local communities, faith groups, NGOs, and other civil society and business organizations:
- Facilitate the development of peace and reconciliation summits to promote nonviolent communication and mutually beneficial solutions;
- Act as a resource for the creation and the gathering of best practices documents, lessons learned, and peace impact assessments;
- Provide for the training of all military, and civilian personnel who administer postwar reconstruction and demobilization in war-torn societies; and
- Fund the development of peace education curriculum materials for use at all educational levels and support university-level peace studies.

Further, we call upon the UN General Assembly to reaffirm its pledge, as faithful representatives of the governments of the world, to join "We the Peoples" in creating a peaceful world in the spirit of the UN Charter, thus advancing the **Culture of Peace** within each nation, each culture, each religion, and each human being for the betterment of all humankind and future generations. In making this call, we gratefully acknowledge the long history of work already accomplished within the UN toward this end, including:

- All the UN documents written on the Culture of Peace since June 1945, in particular, the Charter of the United Nations, which is dedicated to saving succeeding generations from the scourge of armed conflict, calls for nations to live together in peace as neighbours, and takes to heart its emphasis on the vital role "We the Peoples of the United Nations" are to play in "realizing a peaceful, just and compassionate neighbourhood;"
- Our Common Agenda (OCA), including the call in the 2021 OCA report by Secretary-General Guterres for a "new agenda for peace" to accelerate the implementation of existing UN agreements;
- The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which states that the foundation
 of freedom, justice, and peace is the recognition of the inherent rights of all
 members of the human family without exception and that all human beings
 should act towards one another peacefully and in the interest of the common
 good;
- The UN resolution 52/15 of 20 November 1997, proclaiming the year 2000 as the "International Year for the Culture of Peace", and A/RES/53/25 of 19
 November 1998, proclaiming 2001-2010 the "International Decade for a Culture of Peace and Nonviolence for the Children of the World;"



- The UN resolution 53/243 adopted by consensus on 13 September 1999 and annually reaffirmed by the General assembly High-Level Forum in which the UN Declaration and Program of Action for a Culture of Peace gives clear guidelines for governments, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), civil society and people from all walks of life to work together to strengthen the global Culture of Peace as we live through the 21st century;
- The Constitution of the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural
 Organization (UNESCO), which states, "since wars begin in the minds of men, it
 is in the minds of men that the defences of peace must be constructed", and the
 important role UNESCO is mandated to fulfill in promoting the global Culture of
 Peace;
- Security Council resolution 1325 of 31 October 2001 on Women, Peace, and Security, which acknowledges for the first time the crucial importance of women's participation in the peace processes, and the follow-up Security Council Resolution 1820 of 19 June 2008 by the same name; and
- The many other key UN Culture of Peace documents, including A/RES/52/13, 15
 January 1998 Culture of Peace; A/RES/55/282, 28 September 2001 International
 Day of Peace; and the 2005 Mid-Decade Status Report on the International
 Decade for a Culture of Peace and Nonviolence for the Children of the World.

In conclusion, we, global citizen signatories from 192 Nations, respectfully in one voice, affirm that we:

- Are motivated by the recognition that human beings in the billions have suffered the atrocities of violent conflict, poverty, and human-induced environmental disasters, and are thus now, more than ever, committed to saving future generations from these scourges by living in peace and by building the Economies of Peace at the individual, national, and global levels that will sustain these efforts:
- Stand in solidarity with all efforts to overcome the persistence of violent conflict in various parts of the world and the proliferation of nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons, which threaten the existence of our planet;
- Believe in the goodwill of all the Member States of the UN and in the increasing political will of each Member State to "promote social progress and better standards of life based in the growing freedoms and capabilities created by global peace;" and
- Acknowledge the urgent need to rebuild the trust of the world's citizens in governments and to establish effective working relationships between and among nations through the cultivation of shared interests and common ground that form the foundation of global peace.



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
